### Regarding quality of Pigeon plastic made nursing bottles

We would like to express our sincere gratitude for your continued patronage of our products.

On October 19th 2020, an article on "Microplastic release from the degradation of polypropylene feeding bottles during infant formula preparation" was published from Nature Food.

The raw materials for our plastic nursing bottles are polyphenylsulfone (PPSU) and polypropylene (PP). Any of Pigeon nursing bottles have undergone hygiene tests on food contact materials required by the regulation laws of Europe (Food Contact Regulation (EU) 10/2011) and the law of Japan (Food Sanitation Law) to confirm their safety.

On the other hand, there are only few studies on the effects of microplastics on the human body, and there is not enough information to draw definite conclusions. Since we also produce and offer glass nursing bottles, for customers who are concerned about using plastic nursing bottles, we recommend to use nursing bottles which are made of glass.

In this article, it is suggested that further tests and research on the effects on the human body are necessary from now on, so we will pay close attention to the trends and strive to develop safe products which our customers can use our products with peace of mind.
